### **ORDINANCE 18-1365**

CITY OF WOODBURN, INDIANA

## AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING A CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN SPECIFYING PROJECT SPENDING ALLOCATED FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PURPOSES THROUGH 2022

WHEREAS, Allen County has adopted a Local Income Tax for Economic Development ("LIT – Economic Development"); and

WHEREAS, IC 6-3.6-6-9.5 grants authority for the executive of a city to adopt a capital improvement plan specifying the uses of the additional revenue to be allocated for economic development purposes; and

WHEREAS, previously the economic development allocation was not to exceed .40% of collected county income taxes, which increased approximately by 33% after the passage of R-54-17 by the City of Fort Wayne on July 11th, 2017; and

WHEREAS, IC 6-3.6-6-9.5 stipulates that a capital improvement plan must incorporate projects whose cost is at least 75% of the additional revenue allocated for economic development purposes, or roughly \$1,000,000 through 2022 for the City of Woodburn;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Woodburn Common Council, that "Exhibit A" be considered the City's Capital Improvement Plan for years 2018 through 2022, which shall be amended as either changes demand or by an expired timetable. This Capital Improvement Plan should be considered in tandem with the "Woodburn Strategic Investment Plan-2016" as presented on September 6<sup>th</sup>, 2016, which was approved by the Woodburn Common Council via Resolution 16-212. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

No part of this Ordinance shall be interpreted to conflict with any local, state, or federal laws and all reasonable efforts should be made to harmonize the same. Should any section or part thereof of this Ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole, or any other portion thereof other than that portion so declared to be invalid, and for this purpose the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.
