

ORDINANCE 19-1374

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WOODBURN, INDIANA COMMON COUNCIL ADOPTING A MULTI-HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN

WHEREAS, a proposed Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan (“Plan”) has been prepared for the Board of Commissioners of the County of Allen, the City of Woodburn, the City of New Haven, the City of Fort Wayne, the Town of Grabill, the Town of Huntertown, the Town of Leo-Cedarville, the Town of Monroeville, and the Maumee River Basin Commission; and

WHEREAS, said Plan has received the approval of the State of Indiana and the Federal Emergency Management Agency; and

WHEREAS, the adoption of said Plan is in the best interests of the residents of the County of Allen.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Woodburn of the County of Allen, that the corresponding section be updated and amended to adopt the new Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan for the City of Woodburn as follows:

The City of Woodburn acknowledges and accepts the proposal as accepted by the Allen County Board of Commissioners regarding the Allen County Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan, as approved, and dated October, 2017 as prepared by the POLIS Center at IUPUI and is hereby adopted in its entirety, and incorporated herein by reference.

This Ordinance shall become effective as of the date of passage.
